

HUMAN RIGHTS INTERNSHIP (3 WEEKS)

Human Rights students may participate in internship programs with leading national and international NGOs based in Budapest during the Research Module. In the previous years students were hosted by – among others – the Mental Disability and Advocacy Center, the European Roma Rights Center, the Hungarian Civil Liberties Union, the Hungarian Helsinki Foundation, the Chance for Children Foundation, the Public Interest Law Institute, the European Center for Not-for-Profit Law, Menedek Hungarian Association for Migrants and the Legal Defense Bureau for National and Ethnic Minorities.

Some of the cooperating NGOs require interns to hold a law degree, hence certain internships are available to HR LL.M. students only (a detailed list of NGOs offering internship placement is distributed by the Special Project Officer in Module III). The hosting organizations choose among the candidates based on their academic background, interest and motivation letter. The internship must last at least three weeks (approximately 50 working hours) and culminate with a final project report. After the successful completion of the three-week internship the student may receive one credit, provided that their final internship report is accepted by the Special Project Officer. The 3-week internship program is restricted to ten students, unless there are additional places available at the hosting organizations.
