

Edwin Rekosh is the Executive Director and founder of Columbia University's Public Interest Law Initiative (PILI). For more than a decade, Mr. Rekosh has been a leader in the effort to advance human rights principles and promote the development of public interest law throughout Central and Eastern Europe, the Balkans and the former Soviet Republics. He is a member of the adjunct faculty at Columbia University School of Law and a visiting Professor at Central European University. He previously worked for the International Human Rights Law Group in Romania and as a consultant for the Ford Foundation.
